# ANNEX I EXAMPLES OF STRUCTURE OF ESA REPORTS

There are many ways to organize and structure an ESA report and these vary according to context. These examples illustrate some of the common structures that may fit your context. In Example 1, ECE is integrated across each chapter. In Example 2, ECE has a separate chapter.
